

WILLIAM WOLLER

William Woller, an artist of the impressionist school who fled Germany after the rise of Hitler, died of a heart attack yesterday. He lived at 430 Lafayette Street. His age was 47. He was stricken while visiting a friend at 449 East Fourteenth Street.

Mr. Woller came to this country in September, 1949. He had studied in Dresden, Berlin and Bielefeld. His work was exhibited in the Moller Gallery, Berlin, but expressionism in art was labeled "degenerate" by Hitler, and he fled to Rio de Janeiro in 1939. His work was exhibited there with other modern artists in 1945. He had been planning a showing in Germany.
